



Thurrock Community Safety Partnership has been working hard and listening to residents to make **Stanford and Corringham** a safer place

You Said:

Youths were causing a nuisance and behaving anti-socially particularly on Friday and Saturday nights in a number of areas including Corringham Town Centre and Hardie Park, Stanford-Le-Hope.

We Did:

Introduce dispersal orders in Corringham Town Centre and Hardie Park which give the police greater powers to disperse groups. Anyone ignoring the order can be arrested. The orders were launched with a high visibility joint operation between the Police, Youth Offending Service, Youth & Connexions and Community Protection Team. High visibility patrols continue and young people are stopped and checked in the affected areas and alcohol seized.

You Said:

Drainage was a problem for properties in Avondale Gardens, Stanford-Le-Hope.

We Did:

Thurrock Council's Environmental Health officers liaised with residents and drainage experts to ensure the problem was resolved.

What We Plan to Do:

The issue of nuisance motorbikes across the borough is being addressed with the installation of signage explaining powers which include seizing any unauthorised vehicle. Signs are being put up in a number of areas including Rainbow Lane, Stanford-le-Hope. We are introducing 'No Cold Calling Areas' at sheltered housing complexes where required in Thurrock, to protect residents from rogue traders and burglars.

How You Can Help Us:

The Partners of the Thurrock Community Safety Partnership continue to work to make your area safer and feel safer. Neighbourhood Policing Teams dedicate 80 per cent of their time patrolling your neighbourhood but they cannot be on every street every minute of the day.

Everyone can make a difference in the fight against crime, ensuring they secure their home, car, garage and shed and avoid leaving valuables on show. Remember to shut all doors and windows and never leave your car running while unattended. Property marking kits are also available from your local police station.
